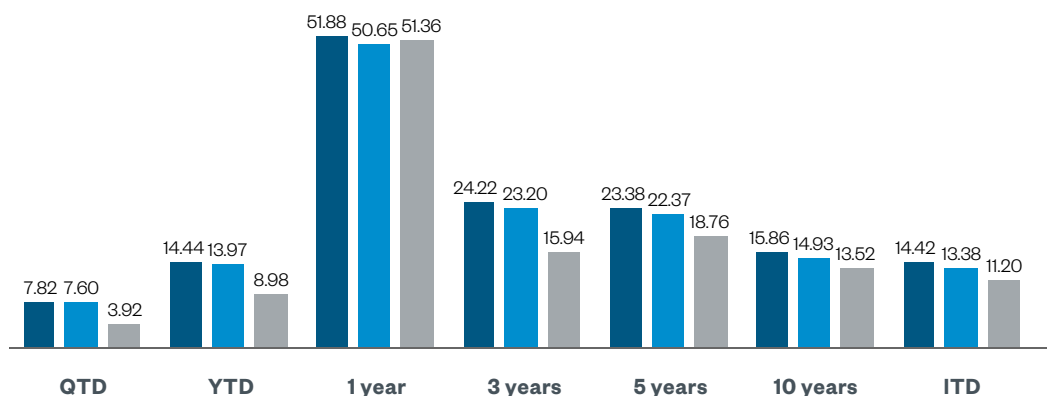
Strategy objectives

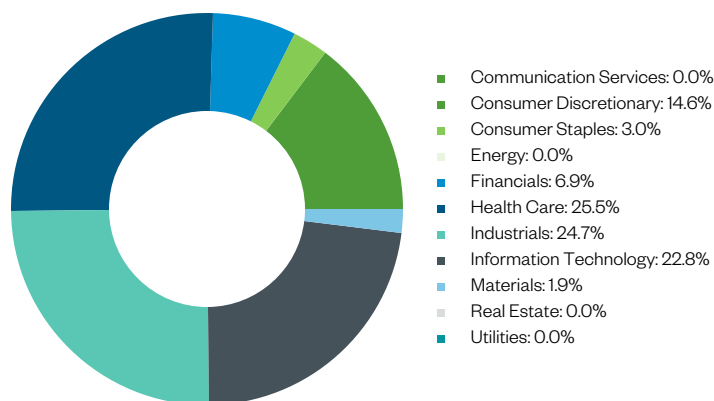

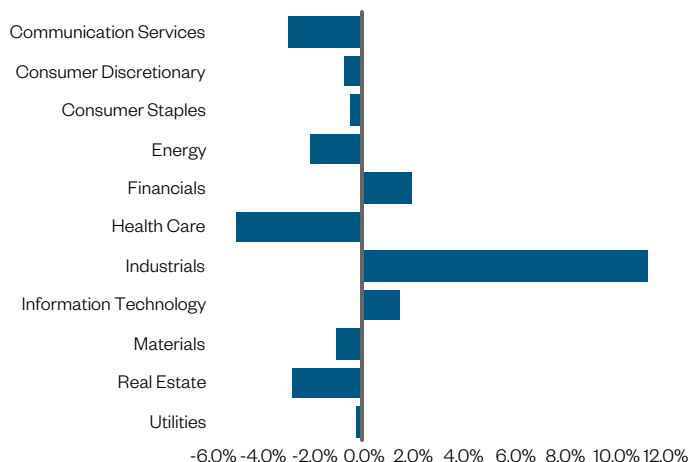
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Portfolio exposure by sector

Commentary

During the second quarter 2021, the Axiom US Small Cap Equity Strategy ("Strategy") outperformed the Russell 2000 Growth Index ("Index") net of fees. The Strategy remains ahead of the benchmark on a net of fees basis over the year-to-date, 3-year, 5-year, 10-year, and since inception periods.

The second quarter was another positive, but turbulent quarter highlighted by volatility in interest rates and inflation expectations. Robust economic data continued to reflect the ongoing recovery driven by monetary and fiscal policy tailwinds. Higher reported inflation and associated FOMC communication sparked concerns that the Fed may taper asset purchases or raise interest rates earlier than generally expected. The pace of global vaccinations accelerated but pockets of COVID outbreaks were further complicated by the emergence of the delta variant. As a result, rotations between value/cyclical companies and growth/defensive companies continued as markets juggled increasing mobility and economic activity on one hand versus inflation concerns and the evolving pandemic on the other.

Seven out of the 11 GICS sectors were positive contributors to relative performance in the second quarter. The best performing sector on a relative basis was industrials, led by strong performance from power generation equipment manufacturer Generac, precision agriculture technology provider Raven Industries, and motion control supplier Altra Industrial Motion Corp. Other top contributing sectors included consumer discretionary, led by casual apparel retailer American Eagle, and health care, driven by fertility benefits solutions provider Progyny. The largest detracting sectors for the quarter included financials, which faced headwinds from falling interest rates, consumer staples on potential margin pressure, and an underweight portfolio position in communication services.

From an individual stock perspective, the best relative contributors for the quarter were American Eagle, Boot Barn- a western and work-related footwear and apparel retailer, Generac, Dick's Sporting Goods- a national retailer of sports equipment and apparel, and Raven Industries. These companies reported better than expected fundamental performance with dynamic growth and margin opportunities looking forward to second half 2021 and 2022. The largest relative detracting stocks were Allegiant Travel Company- a low-cost airline carrier focused on direct flights to underserved cities and leisure destinations, Ensign Group- a skilled-nursing facility operator, and Exponent- a multi-disciplinary consulting firm focused on litigation, regulatory, and design work. These companies reported solid fundamental results, but continue to be negatively impacted in the short term by rising input costs and continued COVID-related headwinds.

Axiom continues to focus investments on dynamic growth stocks delivering superior growth and profitability. Economic growth is expected to significantly improve throughout 2021. Small cap valuations are elevated relative to history, while forward earnings revisions have materially recovered, and earnings growth expectations remain robust. COVID trends, vaccine distribution, the pace of economic reopening, fiscal/monetary policy actions, and geopolitical risks will continue to result in periods of elevated volatility and uncertainty in equity markets. While we continue to closely monitor these events, our focus remains on fundamental, bottom-up investing in innovative, higher quality small cap companies that are visibly and dynamically growing their revenues and earnings faster than prevailing economic growth rates. Well-capitalized, profitable, and reasonably valued growth companies that are executing in the current environment remain a differentiated and compelling area of investment.

Composite Description: The US Small Cap Equity - IPO Eligible strategy (the "Composite") is designed for investors who seek to invest in a broadly diversified portfolio of small cap equities. Portfolios are invested in smaller capitalization equity and equity-related securities in companies located within the United States. Currencies may be actively managed to reduce portfolio volatility. The Composite represents the performance of all Institutional small cap style fee-paying, discretionary equity accounts, regardless of asset size and comingled fund(s) that are eligible to invest in Initial Public Offerings. The Composite was initiated and created in September 2006. A list of composite descriptions, a list of limited distribution pooled fund descriptions, a list of broad distribution pooled funds and performance results are available upon request.

Benchmark Description: The benchmark is the Russell 2000 Growth index, which is designed to measure the performance of the small cap growth segment of the U.S. equity universe. The benchmark is calculated on a total return basis and is free float-adjusted market cap weighted and unmanaged.

Significant Cash Flow Policy: Accounts with a cash flow greater than 20% of the portfolio market value are excluded for the month.

Reporting Currency: Valuations are computed and performance is reported in U.S. dollars.

Fees: Gross of fees returns are presented before management and custodial fees but after all trading expenses. Net of fees returns are calculated by deducting the highest fee from the monthly gross composite return which is expressed above in the stated fee schedule. Returns include the reinvestment of income. The fee schedule for the Axiom U.S. Small Cap Equity Portfolio, which is included in the US Small Cap Equity Composite - IPO Eligible is listed above. The total expense ratio as of December 31, 2020 was 0.61%. The Axiom U.S. Small Cap Equity Trust CIT, which is also included in the composite has an all-in fee (management fees & expenses) of 0.70%.

Internal Dispersion: Internal dispersion is calculated using the asset-weighted standard deviation of annual gross returns of those portfolios that were in the composite for the entire year. If 5 or less accounts, N/A is shown.

Annualized Standard Deviation: The three-year annualized standard deviation measures the variability of the composite gross returns and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. The standard deviation is not required for periods prior to 2011.
